How do we encourage patient engagement?

1. AWTTC identifies patient organisations for each appraisal via an internet and database search and contact is made by phone and email
2. The Chair invites patient and carer input at AWMSG meetings when announcing the appraisals scheduled
3. Section 14 of Form B asks the applicant company to identify relevant patient organisations
4. AWMSG website – patient organisation section

Patient and Public Interest Group

- Established 2013
- Open invitation to patients/carers and patient organisations
- Meets quarterly at AWTTC in Llandough Hospital
- Last meeting held October 2016. Next March 2017.
- Discussion - health technology appraisal process, interim commissioning (One Wales), IPFR, on-going consultations, patient information leaflets, projects e.g. citizens jury
